Synopsis

The trends are rapidly changing in the way dental practitioners manage and treat dentin hypersensitivity. Patients often seek fast and most effective way to combat their sensitivity. This lecture will provide an update on the latest research findings on the treatment of dentin hypersensitivity especially compared to other various technologies available in the dental office. It will also discuss examples in which dental practitioners performing various dental procedures may deal with patients presented with dentin hypersensitivity.

Synopsis

Whilst gingivitis may be the most common dental condition seen in our patients, due to various assumptions and beliefs it is commonly ignored by our patients and dental profession. However, gingivitis and its management deserve our attention since we know that periodontitis cannot occur without gingivitis. Yet today, as dentists we are unable to ascertain which gingivitis patients will develop periodontitis later.

This lecture will provide an overview of gingivitis and its importance/relevance in helping our patients achieve and maintain good oral health. In addition, how management of gingivitis using a simple clinical protocol can be "rewarding" to both patients and clinicians - resulting in a win-win situation.
